PAZ PRIZE FOR POETRY

Miami Book Fair doesn't just present great books, it rewards them — and in partnership with the National Poetry Series, we proudly award the Paz Prize for Poetry biannually to a collection written in Spanish by a poet living in the U.S. The winner receives a cash award, translation of their work into English, and publication by prestigious independent publisher Akashic Books. Our 2020-22 Paz Prize recipient — who will be participating in this year's Fair programming — is Mexican American poet **ALEJANDRO PÉREZ-CORTÉS** for *Ima y Coli son el árbol que nunca fue semilla/ Ima and Coli: The Tree That Was Never a Seed.*
