



The organization's activities are deeply rooted in Haitian cultural traditions, providing a space for community gathering and cultural expression.

JOANN MILORD is a seasoned leader in economic development and community revitalization who currently serves as president/CEO of the Little Haiti Revitalization Trust, where she manages a \$6 million budget to support redevelopment and cultural preservation initiatives. With a strong background in loan underwriting, business development, and strategic planning, she has led impactful programs through roles at North Miami Beach CRA, Miami Bayside Foundation, and the Haitian American Chamber of Commerce of Florida. A passionate advocate for small-business empowerment, Milord is also a published author, educator, and founder of the YOPRO Awards, and has been recognized for her contributions by the city of Miami, the Haitian Consulate, and the Florida Redevelopment Association.

FRANÇOIS ALEXANDRE, born in Okay, Ayiti, is a dedicated community leader, entrepreneur, and father whose work centers on service, sustainability, and self-determination. A graduate of Florida International University, he is the founder/CEO of Konscious Kontraktors Ink, a construction cooperatives consulting firm providing affordable home repairs to underserved communities. As board president of Concerned Leaders of Ti Ayiti (KLOTA) and advisor to TAPRARI, he champions environmental justice and community resilience. A survivor of police brutality, Alexandre has turned hardship into purpose, launching grassroots initiatives such as the Kare Pakage and Klean Streets Klean Mind to uplift Ti Ayiti. In 2021, he extended his advocacy by running for Miami's District 5 commission seat, remaining steadfast in his commitment to building lasting, people-centered change.

LEONIE M. HERMANTIN is a Haitian-born community development expert with more than 20 years of grassroots experience in Miami's Haitian community. She has held several key leadership roles, including executive director of the Haitian-American Foundation, director

of research and strategic planning at Sant La, and deputy director of the Lambi Fund of Haiti. Through her firm, Hermantin Consulting LLC, she has worked on initiatives supporting education and development in both Haiti and the U.S., collaborating with organizations like The Children's Trust, FOKAL, and FIU. She currently serves as director of development, communications, and strategic planning at Sant La, and holds a JD from UC Berkeley and a master's in urban and environmental planning.

ABRAHAM METELLUS is a certified general contractor and real estate sales associate with a background in civic engagement, construction, and cultural preservation. His work spans affordable housing, public infrastructure, and community revitalization projects throughout South Florida. With roots in church and community service, he remains committed to building sustainable, culturally grounded spaces that empower underserved communities.

After graduating with honors in 1986, she became a children's librarian at the Queens Public Library and later an assistant coordinator of children's services. Louisdhon-Louinis joined Miami-Dade's public library system in 1997 and quickly ascended to the role of assistant director of outreach, programming, and special services. One of her major accomplishments during her tenure there was implementing the Art of

DANCE STUDIO — THEATER WORKSHOP: EXPRESSION, IDENTITY & HERITAGE THROUGH PERFORMANCE This interactive workshop, co-led by veteran Haitian theater artists Elizabeth Guerin and Florence Jean-Louis Dupuy, invites fairgoers to explore selfexpression and storytelling through the lens of Haitian cultural identity. Participants will engage in theater warmups, roleplay, improvisation, and guided scene work inspired by themes from Haitian history, daily life, and personal experience. The session will provide a safe, creative space for youth to develop confidence, practice collaboration, and connect with their cultural roots through performance. The workshop runs 60-90 minutes and will be held in Haitian Creole and English.

**ELIZABETH GUERIN** is a Haitian actress, writer, and media executive with deep roots in the performing arts. She began her career in Haiti

as a child actor and radio host, later gaining widespread recognition for her roles in theater and broadcast media. In 2006, she founded Imaginart Media Productions, producing Haitian Creole-language plays and cultural programming in the U.S. and Caribbean. Guerin is also a co-owner of Island TV, where she serves as vice president of production. Her lifelong dedication to Haitian theater and storytelling continues to shape and elevate Haitian Creole-language performance across platforms.

FLORENCE JEAN-LOUIS DUPUY is a Haitian director, playwright, producer, and educator with more than three decades of experience in the performing arts. She is the founder of Atelier Théâtre Éclosion, a company dedicated to producing live performances rooted in Haitian culture and storytelling. Jean-Louis Dupuy is widely known for her Haitian Creole adaptation of The Vagina Monologues (Pawol Chouchoun) and for directing major works such as Soufle Van, performed during the bicentennial celebration of Haitian independence. Her repertoire spans historical dramas, musical theater, and comedy, with productions staged in Haiti, the U.S., Canada, and France.

With more than 40 years of legal experience, he has argued landmark immigration cases before the U.S. Supreme Court and authored the widely respected Kurzban's Immigration Law Sourcebook. A former national president and general counsel of the American Immigration Lawyers Association (AILA), Kurzban

She is currently at work on a third novel.

HEROLD PIERRE aka Alouwou Mandjah, is an acclaimed Haitian writer and poet who is proficient in Haitian Creole, French, and English. He is educated in visual arts, architecture, and networking services technology, and his work reflects a deep connection to Haitian culture. Winner of the 2013 Carnafam poetry contest in Florida, Pierre actively contributes to literary projects and cultural programs. His anticipated poetry book and existing works online showcase his versatile talent and engagement with diverse audiences.

Our keynote artist speaker for this event is SERGE TOUSSAINT, a Haitian American muralist and sign artist from Carrefour, Haiti. Toussaint's murals are prominent throughout Miami-Dade County, especially in Little Haiti, where they depict Haitian history, cultural icons, and everyday life. His art often combines vibrant colors with themes reflecting the experiences of the local community. In addition to murals, Toussaint creates functional sign art for local businesses, enhancing the visual landscape of neighborhoods. He has also contributed to community education by offering free art classes at the Little Haiti Cultural Complex. Toussaint's work was recognized with a Florida Folk Heritage Award in 2016, honoring his contributions to the state's cultural legacy.

# IN MEMORIAM:

#### MICHEL ADOLPHE GABRIEL BIENAIME

Michel Adolphe Gabriel Bienaime was a respected Haitian American patriarch and community advocate remembered for his deep devotion to family, faith, and the Haitian diaspora in South Florida.

Born in Haiti, he made Miami his home in the late 1970s, marrying Jennett "Mother Love" Bienaime in 1978 and becoming the cornerstone of a blended family of eight children. Bienaime was an active participant in the life of Little Haiti, speaking out against gentrification at public forums, protesting for Haitian immigrant protections like TPS, and supporting the work of local organizations such as FANM. He served quietly but consistently, often behind the scenes, whether fixing things at the community center or showing up early to set up chairs at events. His activism was always paired with strong faith

and cultural pride; he was a member of Peace Missionary Baptist Church in Miami and remained closely tied to his Haitian roots; a memorial mass was held for him in his hometown of La Vallée, Haiti

Fluent in Haitian Creole and French, he passed down customs, values, and stories to younger generations, serving as a vital bridge between Haiti and the diaspora. In 2025, Little Haiti Book Festival pays tribute to Bienaime's enduring legacy — a man whose name means "wellloved," and whose life reflected that truth in every way. His example of community service and cultural stewardship continues to inspire, reminding us of the quiet yet powerful ways one individual can uplift an entire neighborhood.

Guided by its mission of "empowering families, individuals, and communities through the provision of comprehensive social services," CAHSD offers client-centered support across all stages of life — from before birth to the elderly. Its diverse programs include Head Start early childhood education, youth employment training, housing and utility assistance, substance abuse treatment, senior services, and more. In Little Haiti, CAHSD operates the Haitian-American Senior Center and provides vital assistance to Haitian families, including help with benefits enrollment and emergency relief. - MIAMI CITY COMMISSIONER CHRISTINE KING serves as chair of the Miami City Commission and is the commissioner for District 5, which includes Little Haiti. She is the first woman to chair the commission and has focused on uplifting underserved neighborhoods through economic initiatives and cultural programs. King frequently engages with Little Haiti's residents and has celebrated Haitian heritage, from hosting cultural events at City Hall to supporting local arts in the district. - BOOKS FOR FREE is a literacy initiative spearheaded by The Children's Trust in collaboration with Miami Book Fair at Miami Dade College. The program aims to place free, high-quality books into the hands of children who need them most, fostering a lifelong love of reading. Through a network of nearly 80 public bookshelves located in clinics, parks, and community centers across Miami-Dade County, Books for Free distributes approximately 2,443 new and gently used books each week. This equates to more than 250,000 books annually, ensuring that children, many from under-resourced neighborhoods, have access to engaging literature they can take home and share with their families. The program extends its reach at events like Little Haiti Book Festival, nurturing a culture of reading within the community. By eliminating cost barriers, Books for Free plays a vital role in promoting early literacy, educational equity, and community involvement throughout the county.
- READ TO LEARN BOOK CLUB is a cherished early literacy initiative from The Children's Trust that brings the joy of reading directly into the homes of Miami-Dade's youngest learners. Launched in 2015, the program provides a free monthly book — delivered by mail — to children from birth through age 4 1/2, ensuring that every child can begin building their own library. With more than 1.6 million books distributed to date, the program offers titles in English, Spanish, and Haitian Creole, reflecting the rich diversity of the community it serves. By empowering parents and caregivers to read aloud in their home languages, including Haitian Kreyòl, the book club supports early brain development, school readiness, and a lifelong love of reading. At Little Haiti Book Festival, The Children's Trust shares this impactful resource with Haitian American families, reinforcing the message that reading starts at birth and every child deserves stories of their own.
- FAMILY ACTION NETWORK MOVEMENT (FANM), formerly known as Haitian Women of Miami, is a powerful Haitian-led nonprofit organization based in Miami, founded in 1991 by Miami-Dade County Commissioner Marleine Bastien. With a mission to uplift and empower Haitian American families, FANM provides a wide range of wraparound services, including immigration assistance, domestic violence intervention, health care access, counseling, job training, civic education, and after-school programs. Beyond direct services, FANM is a force in advocacy, championing causes such as affordable housing, immigration reform, and climate justice, while ensuring that the voices of low-income and immigrant communities are heard in policy debates. Through leadership

development, cultural programming, and grassroots activism, FANM continues to strengthen the Haitian American community in South Florida. As a 2025 sponsor of Little Haiti Book Festival, the organization will be on-site offering valuable information about its programs and furthering its commitment to education, empowerment, and community connection.

- SANT LA (HAITIAN NEIGHBORHOOD CENTER) is a cornerstone nonprofit serving the Haitian American community of South Florida.   LEADERS OF LITTLE HAITI) is a grassroots leadership initiative based in Miami's Little Haiti neighborhood, dedicated to empowering residents especially youth and preserving the community's cultural and economic future. Co-founded by Haitian American social entrepreneur François Alexandre, KLOTA works to "bridge community to better government" by engaging in civic advocacy, youth leadership training, and cultural preservation. The coalition organizes public forums, service projects, and creative partnerships with organizations like TAPARI and Future of Cities, all aimed at strengthening community identity amidst rapid change. As a proud partner of Little Haiti Book Festival, KLOTA helps shape inclusive programming, uplifts young voices, and embodies the spirit of konbit, working together for the good of all.
- MOAD (MUSEUM OF ART AND DESIGN AT MDC), the flagship art museum of Miami Dade College, is dedicated to contemporary art and design exhibitions and educational outreach. Located in the historic Freedom Tower, MOAD strives to be a catalyst for community dialogue and empowerment through the arts. The museum extends its reach beyond its walls with programs like the GO GO MOAD mobile art studio for kids, which brings hands-on art activities to community events. At Little Haiti Book Festival, MOAD's education team hosts creative art-making sessions for children through "Create! With GO GO MOAD", incorporating Haitian themes and encouraging youth to express themselves artistically. MOAD's partnership in the festival connects visual art with literary culture, inspiring the next generation of artists and readers in Little Haiti.
- IRIS PHOTO COLLECTIVE is a group of accomplished photographers of color including Pulitzer Prize-winning photojournalist Carl Juste committed to documenting the experiences of communities of color in their own voices.

  Based in Little Haiti at the IPC ArtSpace gallery, the collective

creates exhibitions and programs that bridge Haitian, Caribbean, and African diaspora stories with the wider community. Its location in Little Haiti is a gallery and event space dedicated to nurturing connections between Haitian and Latin American artists and the public. By joining Little Haiti Book Festival, Iris Photo Collective enriches the event with visual storytelling, displaying powerful images of Haitian life and offering workshops that encourage creative self-expression through photography.

• LOGAN MASTERWORKS is a Miami-based "arts and letters" company providing writing, translation, and publishing services at loganmasterworks.com. Founded by Haitian-born author and editor Michèle Jessica (M.J.) Fièvre and artist Thomas Logan, Logan Masterworks functions as a guild of professionals — including writers, translators, and illustrators — dedicated to helping diverse voices tell their stories with quality and authenticity. The firm offers coaching for authors, ghostwriting, editing, Haitian Creole translation, and even interpreter training, bridging language and culture in literature. As a sponsor of Little Haiti Book Festival, Logan Masterworks amplifies Haitian American storytelling, supporting local writers and ensuring that Haitian Creole language and narratives are well represented in Miami's literary scene.

#### **GENEROUS GUARDIANS**

- DR. ANGELO E. GOUSSE, a renowned Haitian American urologist and founder of Gousse Urology in South Florida, is internationally recognized for his pioneering work in bladder health and reconstructive urology. A passionate community advocate, Gousse launched the Haitian Creolelanguage radio show "Consultation Urologique en Kreyòl" to educate Haitian audiences about health, and co-founded the Haitian American Leadership Organization (HALO) to mentor emerging Haitian professionals. Through his practice, he supports free health seminars, scholarships for Haitian American youth, and medical philanthropy in Haiti. His generous sponsorship of Little Haiti Book Festival reflects his enduring commitment to uplifting the Haitian diaspora through health care, education, and cultural pride, making him a trusted leader and ally in the movement for community empowerment.
- COLUMBUS CLINICAL SERVICES, LLC is a dynamic Miami-based medical facility dedicated to advancing health care through clinical research, education, and community engagement. In keeping with its mission, CHS offers free primary and specialty medical care — including mental health, pediatrics, and OB/GYN — to uninsured patients, and it supports new immigrants with health education and cultural integration programs. Over the decades, CHS became renowned as Miami's main provider of HIV/AIDS-related services for Haitian Americans , and it continues to lead culturally sensitive public health initiatives such as COVID-19 education and vaccination campaigns in the community. Through these efforts, the center has greatly impacted the well-being of South Florida's Haitian population by delivering accessible care and advocacy tailored to its needs.
- CENTER FOR SELF-SUFFICIENCY (CFSS) is a Miami nonprofit organization founded in 2006 to help immigrants and low-income individuals achieve economic and social self-reliance. Led by executive director Edeline B. Mondestin, RN, a Haitian American community advocate, CFSS empowers families by offering programs such as job training, financial literacy, family counseling, and youth mentorship. CFSS has been particularly active in the Haitian community, connecting residents to resources and organizing leadership initiatives in Little Haiti. By supporting Little Haiti Book Festival, the center reinforces its mission to educate and uplift, encouraging self-sufficiency through knowledge, culture, and community engagement.
- THE ALLIANCE FOR AGING, the designated Area Agency on Aging for Miami-Dade and Monroe counties, is a nonprofit organization committed to promoting and advocating for the optimal quality of life for older adults and their families. Through a coordinated network of services — including home-delivered meals, transportation, health care access, adult day care, and caregiver support — the organization ensures that seniors can age with dignity, independence, and respect. By reassuring community members that help is available and no one has

to struggle in isolation, the organization fosters hope and healing. As a partner in Little Haiti Book Festival, You Are Not Alone spreads its empowering message to attendees, reminding families and especially youth that the community cares, resources exist for those in need, and together we can overcome difficulties.

Blanc's work is both scholarly and visionary, celebrating Afro-descendant resilience and fostering dialogue on the legacies of the past to inspire empowerment and change.

- KARLINE DELPÊCHE LINDOR is a dynamic Haitian diaspora author and ghostwriter whose work celebrates resilience, culture, and the power of women's voices. She has dedicated her career to amplifying silenced narratives, embodying the motto "l'écris pour les voix réduites au silence" ("I write for voices reduced to silence"). Lindor writes fluently in English and French, with her work published in both languages. Her recent novels showcase this bilingual artistry: Heart Thieves is a suspenseful saga of betrayal and redemption, and Matriarch's Secrets is an emotionally rich story that explores the inner struggles and hidden triumphs of its women characters. Through these and other creative endeavors, Lindor honors her Haitian heritage and brings to life the complexities of diaspora experiences. Her passionate storytelling and community engagement (including appearances at events like Little Haiti Book Festival) have made her a cherished voice in contemporary Haitian literature, inspiring readers and shining a spotlight on the beauty of the culture and the strength of its people.
- Written by Marie M. Pierre, **KIDS LOVE ADVENTURES** is an independent children's book series that celebrates imagination and learning. Pierre, born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, discovered her passion for creative writing in high school and made her publishing debut with *The Adventure of Being a Kid*, a collection of imaginative childhood tales. She continues to write engaging stories, including *Jacob and Jonathan Defeat the Dragon*, which often feature Haitian American characters and themes. At the festival, Pierre will share vibrant stories that inspire young readers and highlight the joy of exploration across cultures.
- FRANTZ "KIKI" WAINWRIGHT is a multitalented Haitian American artist whose work spans poetry, theater, music, and comedy. He moved to Miami in 1982 and later co-founded Sosyete Koukouy, a cultural organization dedicated to preserving Haitian heritage. His creative accomplishments range from leading the folk music band Ayabonmbe to authoring

- the Creole play Vilokan: Teyat Total an 3 Tablo, showcasing his commitment to Haitian storytelling and folklore. Whether performing on stage or mentoring youth, Wainwright infuses his art with humor and heart, celebrating Haitian identity and ensuring the community's stories continue to thrive.
- LANGLICHMIE NORMILE is a Haitian-born filmmaker, author, and philanthropist who draws strength from her rich cultural heritage. Now living in Miami, Normile works in health care by day but pursues her passion for storytelling through writing and film. She has written on spiritual themes for instance, her Kindle essay Spiritual Fasting: A Mystical Fast or Vodou Fast explores the intersection of faith and Haitian Vodou traditions. Her work often highlights the "fighting spirit" she gained from being raised in Haiti, and she actively gives back to the community through youth arts initiatives. At the festival, Normile shares her unique voice as a young Haitian creative, bridging the worlds of spirituality, art, and social impact.
- LILIANE NERETTE LOUIS is a renowned Haitian storyteller and author who has spent a lifetime sharing folkloric tales. After growing up in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, listening to Creole stories, she moved to Miami in 1977 and began enchanting audiences at festivals and schools with Haiti's oral traditions. She has published beloved collections of folk tales notably When Night Falls, Kric! Krac!: Haitian Folktales (1999) as well as children's books like Pumpkin Soup Is for Sunday, preserving the magic of Haitian storytelling for new generations. Through her vivid stories and books, Nerette Louis keeps Haiti's culture alive and earned a Florida Folk Heritage Award in recognition of her contributions. 2025 Presenter
- LOLA PASSE is a South Florida children's author whose imaginative stories carry important environmental messages. A mother of three and lifelong ocean lover, her Ocean Heroes: Saving the Heart of the Sea, is an enchanting adventure that inspires kids to learn about marine life and protect the ocean. The story follows young Alayla and her friends including a friendly dolphin and a rainbow fish on a quest to heal the polluted sea, teaching children about teamwork and conservation along the way. Passe's vibrant tale captivates young readers while encouraging them to become real-life "ocean heroes." She will share her passion for storytelling and marine conservation at the festival, showing that even little heroes can make a big difference.
- LYONEL GERDES is a Haitian American author, journalist, and educator whose memoirs chronicle a life journey from Haiti to the United States. Born in Haiti's Port-au-Prince and raised in Les Cayes, Gerdes survived a tumultuous childhood under the Duvalier era, experiences he recounts in Les Cayes, Haiti: A

Memoir, offering an intimate look at overcoming family trauma. He continued his story in Port-au-Prince, Haiti: Duvaliers' Pax Haitiana Dynasty and My Coming of Age, reflecting on adolescence during the dictatorship and the quest for freedom. Now living in Miami, Gerdes has also written about immigrant life in Miami, Florida: A Sunshine State's Unauthorized and Unredacted Journey. His writing offers a frank and unflinching portrait of resilience. At the festival, he will share these powerful personal histories and what they mean for Haiti's future. 2025 Presenter

- M. KETSIA THEODORE-PHAREL is a celebrated Haitian American writer whose work bridges children's literature and adult fiction. Born in Port-au-Prince, Haiti, and now based in South Florida, she infuses her stories with Haitian culture, history, and imaginative flair. Her acclaimed children's book A Fish Called Tanga invites young readers into the magic of Haitian storytelling, while her novels and short stories explore themes of identity, community, and resilience in the Haitian diaspora. Theodore-Pharel's engaging narratives and her advocacy for Haitian literature have made her a respected voice in the community, inspiring readers of all ages to explore the richness of Haiti's heritage. 2025 Presenter
- MAMA'S LEGUME is a heartwarming children's book by Ashley Registe that celebrates Haitian culture through the love of cooking. The story follows a mother and daughter as they bond over making "legim," a traditional Haitian vegetable stew, with each step infused with family love and Haitian Creole language. She also coordinates Little Haiti Book Festival, fostering community engagement and celebrating Haitian literature, culture, and arts through vibrant programming and inclusive events. Fievre is the author of the bestseller Badass Black Girl, and her passion for

- MY POETIC PULSE is a poignant poetry collection by Patrick Louis, a Miami-based Haitian poet who writes with raw emotion and authenticity. In this book, he delves into the intense feelings of everyday life love, loss, hope, and self-reflection offering readers an intimate look at the resilience of the human spirit. An award-winning poet (honored by the International Society of Poets), Louis uses his verse to encourage others to speak their truth and embrace their authentic voice. - MYRLANDE DESSOURCES is a Haitian American nurse and novelist who transforms her experiences and imagination into compelling fiction. Her debut novel, Happiness Never Comes Alone (2021), follows a young nurse named Anabelle navigating challenges at a prestigious hospital a story informed by Dessources's background in nursing. She has also ventured into historical fiction with Adasa: The Last African Warrior, set in the 1800s, featuring a brave princess who fights to save her kingdom. Through both contemporary drama and epic history, Dessource's writing highlights themes of resilience, courage, and the pursuit of happiness against the odds. She balances a healing profession with her passion for writing, and festivalgoers can meet this multifaceted author to hear how she does it.
- PASCALE MILLIEN is a Haitian American storyteller, dancer, and community activist devoted to preserving Haitian culture through the arts. An accomplished choreographer and performer, Millien infuses her deep love of Haitian folklore into everything she does. She is the author of Tim Tim Jaden Kreyasyon, a collection of Haitian Creole folktales that she shares with children to promote and safeguard her homeland's oral traditions. Millien captivates audiences with her warmth and passion. Her work highlights the beauty of Haiti's storytelling heritage and its power to instill hope, resilience, and cultural pride in the next generation. 2025 Presenter

- RONALD JOSEPH is a Haitian comic book creator whose work spans horror, science fiction, and action. He has illustrated notable independent titles such as *Endangered* (a postapocalyptic sci-fi saga), *Loup Garou* (a werewolf horror one-shot), and *The Silver Star* (a World War II action-horror adventure). Joseph has also contributed his artistry to mainstream comics, providing artwork for IDW series like G.I. Joe: A Real American Hero, Transformers, ROM, and Micronauts. His dynamic, genre-blending style and the unique cultural perspective of his Haitian heritage have made him a celebrated figure in both indie and mainstream comics.
- ROXANE LEDAN, known by her artistic name, Taïno-L, is a Haitian photographer and documentarian born in Les Cayes, Haiti, as well as an author who is deeply passionate about her country's spiritual heritage. Embracing the island's Taíno (Indigenous) legacy through her pseudonym, Ledan infuses her creative work with themes of ancestral identity and Vodou spirituality. As founder of the cultural initiative Ayiti Bèl, she has documented Haitian traditions and ceremonies such as Vodou rites in her photography and film projects, highlighting the fusion of Taíno and African influences in Haitian identity. Through her art and writings (including a recent work on Vodou vèvè symbols, Ledan fosters a deeper appreciation of Haiti's rich spiritual roots and champions the preservation of its cultural identity.
- SHAVEST "MARGARITA" BROTHERSTON is a children's author dedicated to celebrating African diaspora history through engaging storytelling. Written to uplift and guide, this trilingual memoir (available in English, French, and Haitian Creole) stands as a culturally rich and inspirational testament about identity, faith, and a mother's love for both Haitian and international readers.
- VERONIQUE M. PIERRE is an inspirational author and speaker who encourages women to find strength through self-love and healing. She is the author of *The Strongest Woman in the World Is You*, a 21-day guide to self-healing and self-discovery. In this workbook-style tome, Pierre shares personal insights and faith-based encouragement, empowering readers to embrace their God-given resilience and worth. A devoted mother and woman of faith, she infuses her writing with positivity and gratitude, often using the hashtag #GodIsGood in her messages. At the festival, she will offer uplifting words and practical tips from her guide, inspiring attendees to embark on their paths to inner strength and wellness.

Wanègès released her first Haitian Creole poetry album Galata yon Samba in 2001, captivating audiences from New York to Canada with her rhythmic, heartfelt verse. As the author of the bilingual collection NOSTALJI: Kont ak pwezi ayisyen, she honors Haiti's language and legacy through poetry, using her art to strengthen cultural pride and community ties.

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


# SPOTLIGHT: JERRY GILLES

**JERRY GILLES** is the author of the groundbreaking science book Rasin Ayiti Toma: Istwa nou depi kòmansman inivè a, a comprehensive exploration of the universe's origins, tracing the fascinating emergence of life and complexity from simple energy over a 13.8 billion-year timeline. Remarkably, this work stands as one of the first extensive science books written entirely in Haitian Creole, making complex scientific theories accessible and engaging for Haitian Creole-speaking audiences.

Gilles, a dedicated educator and advocate for Haitian culture and knowledge, has generously made this important contribution available online for free as an electronic edition at bookmanlit.org, offering it as his gift to the Haitian community. Through his work, he emphasizes that scientific understanding belongs to all humanity, and he strives to empower





Haitian readers by bridging the gap between advanced scientific concepts and everyday language.
